### Quick tip: Turning on YouTube Restricted Mode

If you allow children to access YouTube at home, you may well be concerned about the possibility of them seeing inappropriate content. But you can turn on a further setting within YouTube, called Restricted Mode, to reduce the risk of the children encountering harmful content. Childnet has recently published a helpful article on its website about how to set Restricted Mode.

## Campaign urges government to keep childcare vouchers

The Childcare Voucher Providers Association (CVPA) has launched a campaign to persuade the government to retain childcare vouchers. Under current plans, existing childcare voucher schemes are due to close to new entrants on 4 October, with the expectation that most parents will use the new Tax-Free Childcare (TFC) scheme instead - or the childcare element of Tax Credits/Universal Credit. However, the CVPA claims that 90% of parents will be better off using childcare vouchers than TFC. Certainly it can be hard to compare the benefits of the two systems as it depends on whether both parents work, how much they earn and how many children they have, in order to decide which scheme is more beneficial to a particular household.
